Rich treasure house of plant samples, molecular study

The Rajagopal Maharajan and Centre for Molecular Spectroscopy (CMS) and the adjoining National Natural History Museum will be among the finest beneficiaries of the herbarium and botanical support established to St. Joseph's College in Tiruchirappalli by the University Grants Commission (UGC).

"This building is not really reflective of Indian architecture," says Dr. S. K. Srinivasan, director, NHTT. The herbarium and natural history museum are in a 150-year-old building that has been acknowledged as a landmark in the town right by the Bharathidasan University. St. Joseph's College is the oldest Catholic institution in the town.

Highlights in heart of the nation, the late President A.P.J. Abdul Kalam on Monday suggested a three-dimensional approach involving meaningful education, religious harmony and poverty alleviation to make India a developed nation by 2020.

While imparting education along with value systems, religion must be linked through spirituality. Accepting that theories of religion could not be converted, Dr. Kalam explained that spirituality brings common to all faiths, would serve as a binding factor. And to ensure peace that is vital for achieving the 2020 vision through an enlightened society, poverty must be alleviated, he said.

TN PROFESSORS' HEATER BOX FACE MASK RECEIVES PATENT

PROFESSORS from St Joseph's College along with Anna College of Arts and Science and Prit University have received patent from the Government of India for designing a unique heater box face mask, which can effectively kill virus such as Covid-19 and other pathogens.

Developed by Dr Senthil Kumar of Department of Botany, St. Joseph's College, Dr. Mani Panangal of Department of Biotechnology, Anna College of Arts and Science, Dr. R. Arun Kumar, Dr. Raju Ramasubbu, and Dr. A. Bakrudeen Ali Ahmed from Prit University, the heater box face masks come in three layers, which can inactivate, block or destroy virus and sterilise the air inward and outward for user's natural breathing.

Speaking about the invention, Dr. Mani Panangal said, "The first layer contains a HEPA filter, which does effective blocking, the second contains distinct heating components which kill all viruses and the three has cooling components to allow users freely breathe

and regulate the air heat to atmospheric levels."

The mask will be powered by two USB storage batteries to provide effective protection for eight hours. The heating mask contains three distinct heating components, which can provide heat in 85, 85 and 75 degree Celsius and the cooling component can cool off in 30, 28 and 27 degree Celsius.

Dr. Senthil Kumar added, "The HEPA filters are usually used in laboratories to control virus. On top of this, the heating component can kill all the other strong viruses, which escape through the filters. Because of cooling fans, there will be no shortness of breath and it will make

sure the users breathe comfortably." According to the creators, the manufacturing cost of the face mask can take up to \$3,000 and it can be drastically reduced if produced on a large scale.

This is the second patent received by St Joseph's College, Tiruchi. The scientists on Thursday met the Principal of St Joseph's College, Dr. M Arockiasamy Xavier SJ, and presented a copy of the patent certificate and explained the benefits of the invention.

St Joseph's only college in TN to get special heritage status

Trichy: St Joseph's Autonomous College in Trichy is set to receive a special grant from the University Grants Commission (UGC) under the Special Heritage Status, the only college in the state to be recommended for the fund in the current year. A grant of Rs 1.67 crore will be provided to the college to maintain the heritage structures in the institution.

The college was established in 1844 by the Fathers of Society of Jesus. In 1869, it was affiliated to the Madras University. The college celebrated its centenary in 1944 and sesquicentenary in 1995 and was awarded the Five-Star status by NAAC in 2000. The UGC recognised it as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2004. In 2006, the college was reaccredited with A+

Grade by NAAC.

The College is owned by the Society of St. Joseph's, a body registered under Societies Regulation Act (1860) in Trichy.

Reverend Dr Andrew Francis SJ, principal, said with the grant from UGC, the college would renovate two old structures. The existing museum and herbarium building will be extended, he said.

The principal said funds have also been allocated for a six-month certificate course, one-year diploma course and a research survey where students will study the heritage structures that exist in the city in detail.

According to a list released by the UGC, a total of 19 colleges in the country have been selected under the scheme. The five colleges from the state that sent proposals got rejected except for the 171-year-old institution here.

College gets Messier telescope

'Plans are afoot to study atmosphere of Venus, Jupiter, sun'

A Messier telescope designed by Stephen Hawking's Innovation Club, which can resolve objects separated by a distance of 8.457 arc-seconds, was inaugurated at the Department of Physics, St. Joseph's College, on Friday.

According to P. Christuraj, Club Coordinator, double stars, nebulae, craters of the moon and Apollo landing sites, besides Saturn's rings and crescent of Venus

have been observed through the telescope.

Plans were afoot to study the atmosphere of Venus, Jupiter and sun, he said, exuding confidence that visible electromagnetic spectrum of each individual stars could be collected by using a stellar grating and a CCD (Charge-coupled device) sensor, mounting them on our messier telescope. Messier has a 250 mm diameter of parabolic primary optical mirror that collects a large amount of light and has a focal ratio of f/5 which is a fast

telescope. The fine arrangement of the optical components give us a sharp image of the heavenly bodies which is crucial for useful astronomical studies, N. Ravi, Head, Department of Physics, said.

The telescope was inaugurated by Collector S. Sivarasu in the presence of Principal Rev. Fr. Xavier Arockiasamy.

K. Balakrishnan, Founder, Trichy Astro Club, delivered a talk on basic astronomy and telescopes on the occasion.

Tulasi extraction process gets patent

MEDICINAL properties of Tulasi are often praised by traditional medical practitioners. Now, the process of extracting a particular molecule from the plant and introducing it to cancer cell to prevent its proliferation has received patent from German government. The study was done by research scholar Asha Monica, under the guidance of Dr Senthil Kumar of Department of Botany of St Joseph College in Tiruchy.

"We extracted a molecule from Tulasi and introduced it into the breast cancer cell line. Our research found that the molecule from arrested the growth of breast cancer cell. After getting permission from our government, we submitted the work for patent. We are glad the study got the patent from German government," said Dr Senthil Kumar. Explaining the further stages of the research, Asha Monica said, "In the next stage, we will collect the same

molecule from the plant grown in different districts of Tamil Nadu. We will analyse whether molecules from the plant grown in different districts give the same results. Sometimes, the same molecule collected from a plant in another district can give better results."

Dr Senthil Kumar expressed the hope that the study would help in the production of cheaper medicine for breast cancer. "Tulasi is a common plant and we can find it in most of the

places. We have been using it for several generations. I hope the study comes up with cheap medicine for breast cancer. We are trying our best to make that possible and it would also be of great help to our farmers," he said. College principal Dr M Arockiasamy Xavier SJ said, "In the last four months, our college has secured about three patents. The main aim of our research is to ensure benefit to the common people."

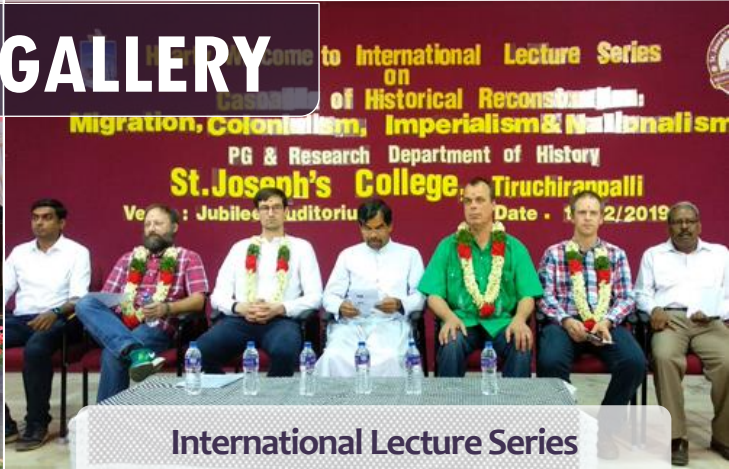

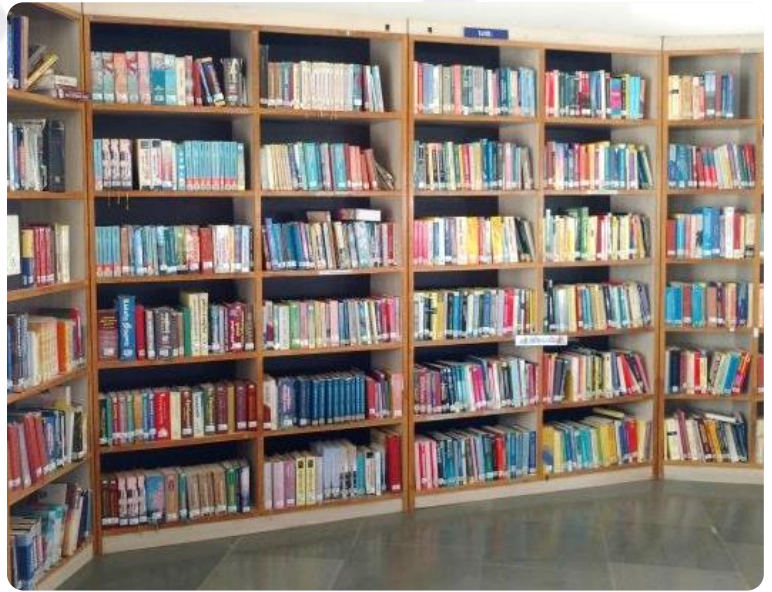
